

Elections: Election Day is Tuesday, November 3rd and your ballot must be received by 8pm on that day. Donald does not have a ballot drop box this year. Check the back of the voter's pamphlet for ballot drop box locations. Postage was included this year on ballots. Marion County website provides local election coverage, Track My Ballot Program, and lots more!

City Hall Open Public Hours: Since June 15th the City Hall staff has served the public at a walk-up window for a limited time during the day. Now, we know that our most popular time slot is between 1pm and 3pm. Starting November 1st, City Hall will be open to serve the public between 1pm to 3pm Monday through Thursday, or by appointment. Masks are required at window. Staff works 40 hours per week.

Clean Up Day: Due to the smoke conditions in September, the Council cancelled the annual Clean Up Day. The Council will consider having it in the spring.

Santa's Sing-a-Long is cancelled due to COVID-19.

Water/Sewer Problem? As a reminder, if your sewer alarm sounds or you have a question about your water service please page the Public Work Team. You call 503-301-6479. Leave your name, phone number, address and short description of problem. If you have questions about your bill call City Hall. PW is available 24/7 and will call you back soon after your page.

Red Tags Starting November 16th

The City will again start delivering delinquent notices for past due water and sewer accounts. If your account is carrying a past due balance of more than 60 days, you will receive a door hanger on 11/19/2020. You will have 48 hours to either make the payment or setup a payment plan to get the balance back to zero. For the months of November and December there will be no additional fees applied. Traffic Violations

Please remember to drive safety, including obeying the speed limits and traffic control devices. Starting in December court will also be held for violations of the Donald Municipal Code.

Donald COVID-19 Financial Assistance Program

For our local residents that have been financially effected by COVID-19, the City Council has a program to help. The City has a program to help those people that are behind in utilities or housing, or have experienced extra costs for technology from home school or distance learning for school. The application and details can be found on the City's website or can be picked up at City Hall. You are also welcome to call City Hall and we will have a packet delivered to you. If it's outside of the operating hours, leave a voicemail with your address and we will get the info to you. A third-party reviews and inspects the applications to ensure that the financial issues were due to COVID-19. This is essential to the City being able to provide this funding, since the money is from the CARES Act from the State. The process is anonymous, the Council does not see your name or any part of the application. Program goes until funds are depleted, and awarded on a first-come-first serve basis. Dog Waste in Donald-It's A Problem

By Public Works Director Alonso Limones Public Works frequently walks the streets, parks and public spaces to pick up dog waste. Lately, we have found more waste being left then what we normally see.

We are reminding dog owners to please remove and dispose of dog waste properly. There are five garbage cans on Main Street and three in our City's Parks that are available for public use.



There are two dog waste stations with plastic bags at the parks for dog owners to use to pick up the waste. Public Works makes sure that these garbage cans are empty and that bags available. Keeping the waste picked up provides a clean appearance of our community. Dog waste also impacts the environment by introducing pollutants into our waterways. Pet waste doesn't decompose in water, instead it adds harmful bacteria that can cause excessive growth of algae and weeds. The EPA agency estimates that just 2-3 days' worth of waste from only 100 dogs can contribute enough bacteria to temporarily close a bay and all watershed areas to swimming or shell fishing within 20 miles! Please remember to pick up after your dog and don't let them run around town off the leash. Keep dogs safe so they don't escape while you are away from home. By picking up the waste, it will reassure other members of the community that you care for your community and the space you live in.

November Driving brings new challenges.
Being prepared is the Big One. Have your vehicle checked out as soon as possible. Make sure all your lights are work-



ing. Make sure your emergency kit is still intact and you that you carry extra drinking water and some snacks. Throw in a big heavy blanket just in case. Try to keep your fuel tank on the full side. Be safe, slow down and teach your passenger to be your co-pilot. My tip for checking your lights is do it at night when you can see your tail lights and blinkers without ever getting out of your car. What Will The Future Donald Look Like? A Call for Volunteer Planning Commissioners By City Planner Holly Byram

QUESTIONS: How do we build a community that is: (choose your preferred adjective) safe, healthy, walkable, affordable, efficient, attractive, resilient? Can our youth find a local job and raise their family here? Can our seniors age in place with access to services and amenities? Can local employees find a home near their jobsite without a long commute? How can we support business investments in Donald? How does our city grow while also protecting the important friendly small-town feeling?

ANSWER: The physical development of a community is guided by a Development Code. Each city's code is different. One size does not fit all. A Planning Commission is a group of local people who volunteer a couple hours each month to review and consider development applications to ensure they meet the Donald Development Code and Comprehensive Plan, with staff support. When the Development Code is out of step for the community, the Planning Commission also plays a role in revising the code. No prior experience is necessary. Successful Planning Commissioners are committed to learning, critical thinking, and thoughtful discussion.

RECRUITMENT: Planning Commission seats are for a period of three years, with typically one evening meeting per month, and some background reading. Applicants must be of legal voting age, and either live in/own property in/own (or manage) a business in Donald. The City is now accepting applications for three of the seven Planning Commission seats. YOU can play an active role in the development of Donald! Information and applications are available online: www.donaldoregon.gov. Application deadline is November 11, 2020. The Planning Commission will make a recommending vote to Council at the November 19th meeting at 6:45pm.
