Harvest Garden PUD Update

The Harvest Gardens Homestead project is composed of four different land use applications. 1) Annexation to bring the property into the city limits, 2) Zone Change to assign the City zoning, 3) Planned Unit Development (PUD) for approval of a mixed-use neighborhood concept developed over a 12-year period, and 4) a Subdivision to divide the land into 299 lots. Public hearings are required at both the Planning Commission and City Council. The applications are separated into two different agenda items in order to keep the criteria and procedures separate and as clear. On Thur., May 28, 2020 the Planning Commission was scheduled to hear the Annexation and Zone Change, and receive a recommendation from staff to continue the public hearing for the PUD and Subdivision applications to the date and time certain of Thur., June 18, 2020 at 6:45pm. The City Council is scheduled to hear the Annexation and Zone Change on Tue., June 9, 2020 at 6:45pm, and the PUD and Subdivision on Tue., July 14, 2020 at 6:45pm. Due to COVID-19 public safety guidelines, the City is working to provide opportunities for the public to participate both in person and remotely via phone or video. Meetings will take place as described in the article titled "Location of City Meetings". Written testimony is also an option when received in advance of each hearing, directed to the City at PO Box 388 Donald, OR 97020, emailed to manager@donaldoregon.gov, or dropped in the City Hall's door slot at 10710 Main St. NE. The full application is available on the City website for review. Staff reports will be available on the website one week prior to each hearing.

The Confidence Report lets you know the performance for one year of a drinking water provider (City of Donald) and that the water you drink and use every day meets or exceeds all health standards. The Oregon Health Authority Drinking Water Program certified that the City of Donald has successfully met the criteria for Outstanding Performance during the last Water System Survey conducted on May 22, 2019. The Consumer Confidence Report (CCR) for Donald for the year 2019 can be found at www.donaldoregon.gov and was also mailed to you with your May utility bill.
