Beginning May 30th, citizens can pick up a packet from City Hall. In order to run you must be a qualified elector by state law, be a registered voter in the State of Oregon (at least 18 years old), registered not less than 20 calendar days immediately preceding any election in the manner provided by law, be a registered voter in the State of Oregon, and according to the Donald City Charter "and has resided in the city during the twelve months immediately preceding the election". If elected,



Urban Growth Boundary Expansion Project

Since Oct. 2017, the City Council and The City Council met on May 8 and held a public hearing for the Donald Planning Commission have periodically Urban Growth Boundary Expansion Project. There was no testimony heard. The Council then conducted the first reading of the City Ordinance that is necessary to adopt the findings of the UGB Study, and changes to the City's Comprehensive Plan. Next steps: The Council will conduct a land and buildings. It contains the second reading of the Ordinance at their June 12 meeting, followed by a vote to adopt it. Grants Status

Master Plans: The City is working with the City Engineer to finish the Water System Master Plan and the Wastewater System Master Plan. These Plans will lay out what needs to be done to serve the new area of Donald with water and sewer services. Both studies are being funded 100% by grants from the Business Oregon/Infrastructure Finance Authority. Each study cost is \$20,000. **Workforce Housing Initiative:** Governor Kate Brown announced that the City of Donald will receive \$675,000 to help build infrastructure to serve the State's problem of workforce housing. The funds come from Oregon Housing and Community Services, and Business Oregon. The City's project ranked number one. This is a pilot project for the State and the City leadership is happy to receive the funds and recognition from the Governor's Office. This money will go toward building a new sewer lagoon and upgrades to the City's water system for the new UGB area but it is not enough to make all the needed changes. Developers and System Development Charges will also pay for the new infrastructure. GK Machine received \$100,000 from the State to help their employees receive down payment assistance or rental assistance too. Sidewalks: The City received a \$50,000 grant from ODOT's Small Cities Allotment funds to install ADA ramps in the sidewalks in downtown Donald. The Council is formulating a local improvement district to construct new sidewalks on Main Street downtown. Since the actual street of Main Street is under the jurisdiction of Do you see something that you want to bring the County, the City will benefit from the County helping to engineer and run the bids for the construction. The property owners in the downtown area will proportionately share the cost of the sidewalk construction, as per City Code Chapter 90. The Council will hold a public hearing on the establishment of the Local Improvement District, and property owners will receive notice and can speak to the Council about this project. Oregon Parks Grant: Planning Commissioner Gerry Waller spearheaded an application for playground equipment and a permanent bathroom for the Donald Little City Park. The amount requested was \$75,000. If successful then the City will need to have volunteers provide labor to meet the required matching portion. Commissioner Waller received word that the application made it past the technical review committee stage. Award winners should find out, by this fall, if they will re-
