
- 1. **Sidewalk Project** help support the project by requesting donations of plants for the downtown area.
- 2. **Donald Clean-Up Day** plan and coordinate the 2nd Annual Donald Clean-Up Day scheduled for Saturday, September 15, 2018. The group is planning the day's event, asking for donations, recruiting volunteers, and requesting business support.
- 3. **Summer Movie Night** researched the possibility of Donald Movie Night during the summer. After much discussion, the project is cost prohibitive at this time.
- 4. **City Welcome Signs** the group is researching reflective tape, or LED lighting, for the three Welcome to Donald signs so they can be more easily seen at night.

Update on UGB Study by City Planner Holly Byram

On Thursday, April 26th at 6:45pm the Donald Planning Commission will hold the first public hearing for the Donald Urban Growth Boundary Amendment. The preferred alternative expected to be

recommended by the Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) on April 5th is shown in yellow. The proposed 87.6 acre expansion would include the needed 76.7 acres of residential as well as 10.9 acres of public facility, which is the city's storm water detention basin south of town. Additional opportunities for public review and comment will be available through a subsequent Donald City Council hearing scheduled for May 8th at 6:45pm; as well as, the Marion County Commissioners will hold a public hearing but the date is to be determined for this meeting.

Elections

The Marion County Elections Department will mail your May Elections ballot to you on April 25. A ballot box is available at City Hall to drop-off your ballot, until 8pm Election Night, May 15th. Marion County has a hired security guard for Election Night, but otherwise the ballots are picked up multiple times a week and delivered to the County Elections Office. You do not need a postage stamp. If you have questions about your ballot, you must call Marion County Elections at 503-588-5041. You can register for the "track my ballot" program on the County Elections' website.

In the November 2018 General Election, you will be asked to vote for a Mayor and three City Councilor positions. If you are interested in running, you can pick up the packet at City Hall starting on May 30. The deadline for filing is August 28.

If you need to register to vote, you can pick up a form at City Hall. If you have time, the State's Election website has lots of interesting info about voting and elections.

Code Compliance

The City of Donald's policy on code compliance is
that all City actions are complaint-driven. At the
April 10th City Council Meeting, they will consider
contracting code enforcement out to the Marion
County Sheriff's Office. Here is a list of common
Code Violations:

- · Portable basketball hoops in the right-of-way or obstructing the sidewalk.
- · Illegal parking of trucks, campers/RVs, & boats in the right-of-way, or vehicles on the street for longer than 72 hours.
- · Properties with garbage and junk piling up and blowing around neighborhoods.
- · People living in RVs.
- · The Donald Municipal Code is available on our website at www.donaldoregon.gov, under the Administration tab.
